More than 20% of graduates apply to professional schools with 95% acceptance to veterinary school, 87% to medical school and 83% to other professional programs. 92% of graduates of the Teaching Certification program pass state exams on the first attempt.

Special Features

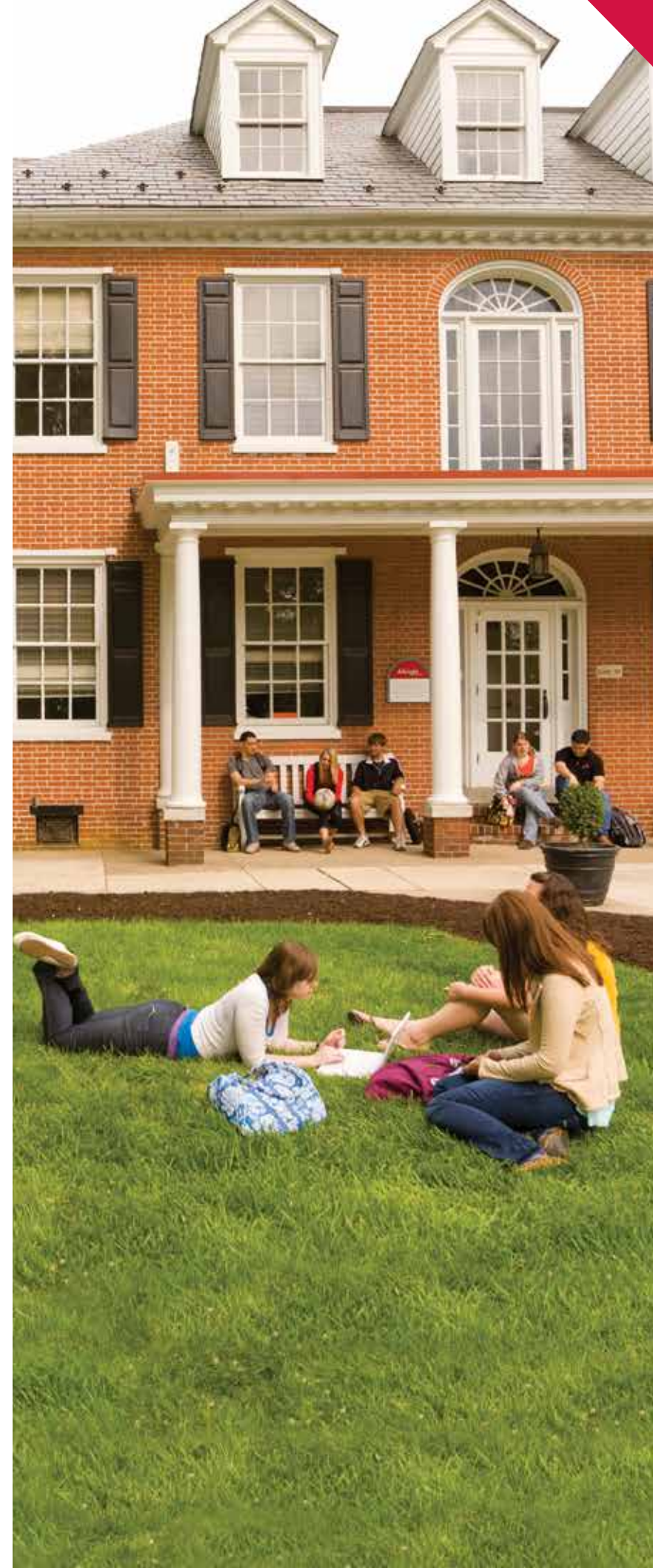
