Special Features

The campus has a long history at its current location in Clarksville, Arkansas dating back to 1891. In the years since the first cornerstone was laid on the site, the campus has undergone continued growth and improvement, with more than 20 buildings now on campus. University of the Ozarks also has the Jones Learning Center (JLC) on campus, which is a comprehensive fee-based program that provides students with learning disabilities, attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (AD/HD), and autism spectrum disorder (ASD) with the skill sets to succeed academically and build brighter futures. The JLC offers more services than any other collegiate program for students with learning disabilities in the nation.

Recognition

University of the Ozarks was one of the first co-educational schools founded west of the Mississippi River. It was the first college in Arkansas to admit women in 1875 and the first college in the nation to establish a program for college students with learning disabilities in 1971.

University of the Ozarks is a member of the NCAA Division III American Southwest Conference.
