Washington College offers the Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of Science (BS) degrees as well as the Master of Arts (MA) in English.

Success Rate

More than 85% of students are employed or enrolled in graduate school within 6 months of graduation.

Special Features

Washington College was the first college chartered in the newly independent United States and is named after the first US president, George Washington. He gave the founding gift to start the college, served on the Board of Visitors and Governors for five years, and received an honorary degree from Washington College in 1789. The college is home to the John S. Toll Science Center, a 45,000 square foot, state-of-the-art classroom, office and laboratory complex with a

penthouse greenhouse and dramatic three-story glass atrium. It also has the Daniel Z. Gibson Center for the Arts which houses a 440 seat Decker Theater, 200 seat Shotwell Recital Hall, 175 seat experimental theater, the Kohl Art Gallery and support space for Music and Drama courses.
